- Opening Moderator-Elect Peggy Chandler
- Financial Update Kathy Harris
 - Kathy referred to her summary report included (along with the most recent financial reports from Disciples Treasury Services on the Regional Board page: https://www.kcdisciples.org/regional-board
 - Total income for the year is \$104,700 compared to a budget of \$91,600 and prior year of \$97,300. Giving and allocated donations are up more than 3.3% from a year ago.
 Total expenses were in line with, but slightly lower than budget and prior year.
 - Treasury Services Vice President, John Goebel, traveled to Kansas City last month to meet with staff members, the Treasurers of GKC DOC and Tall Oaks, the Financial Secretary and via Zoom with the Budget and Finance Committee. These were very productive meetings with a focus on processes and responsibilities
 - Reviewed Designated Funds to clarify purpose and restrictions for the funds.
 We anticipate a summary spreadsheet, along with the organized documents, to be the final outcome.
- UCCR Update Peggy Chandler in collaboration with Kathy Harris
 - A final invoice was received from UCCR for Tall Oaks management through March 31, 2024 in the amount of \$65,430. This has been disputed due to the condition of the property and assets at Tall Oaks at the end of the contract with UCCR. We are awaiting a response from UCCR.

- A renewed Participation Agreement with the Pension Fund for employees, negotiated with the help of Pension Fund representative Rev. - The title was chosen to reflect the importance of this role in the life of the whole church and to recognize the necessity and authority of Rev. Shoemaker to provide critical leadership for planting new churches in new ways and supporting courageous innovation in existing congregations.

- **2024/2025 Board Meeting Dates** – Peggy chandler introduced a motion to clarify regional board meeting dates through December 2025.

Whereas it is helpful to Greater Kansas City Disciples of Christ and the wider Christian Church to know when regular quarterly meetings are scheduled, and,

Whereas it is always possible to move the date of the regional board quarterly meeting as needed with thirty days published notice at the discretion of the regional moderator, and,

Whereas it has become the preference to meet in-person whenever it is safe to do while accommodating some by including Zoom access. and,

Whereas advance planning for meeting location and accommodations can better be done if dates are set for at least a year in advance

Whereas December board meetings are usually scheduled well before Christmas to allow adequate time for end of year reporting and assuring that budget adjustments are shared with Disciples Treasury services before the holiday week.

- Introduced Rev. Kelly Schneikart as the new chair of the Commission on Ministry Innovation
- A new Hispanic DOC congregation may be in formation in North Kansas City
- Consulting with Rev. Mindy Fugarino, pastor for the Independence Boulevard Christian Church. This congregation is exploring the creation of a non-profit corporation to manage the campus as the number of community feeding, social service, arts and health care programs expands bringing together an intersection of neighbors and organizations in the northeast part of Kansas City

- The Anxious Generation: How the Great Rewiring of Childhood Is Causing an Epidemic of Mental Illness by Jonathan Haidt is recommended for anyone working with children and adults born after 1997. The research conducted on the effects of unsupervised, unregulated access to the internet on children and youth since 2010 while their brains are still developing. Results show a statistically significant rise in rates of depression, anxiety, addiction, and suicide. How is the Church supporting parents, children, and youth? How are we holding responsible unscrupulous practices organizations utilizing sophisticated algorithms and AI generated content to manipulate and profit from the vulnerable?
